## How to save water activities

- Start of by discussing with your learners how we use water at home. Write their ideas on the board.
- Recap, or introduce, the concept of imperative verbs with learners and how we can use them to give advice.
- Ask the learners to fill in the gaps on the flashcards with a suitable imperative verb. Make sure you have gone over how to form imperative verbs in their positive and negative forms.
- Use the blank house picture to design activities around saving water in rooms of the house, such as the bathroom and kitchen.
