- Learners can discuss in pairs, or groups, ideas for a plastic free Halloween.
- They can write sentences using the structure 'You + could.....'
- Start off the activity by having a group discussion about Halloween and key words that we use when we talk about this celebration.
- Highlight to learners how much plastic is used at Halloween.
